<u>Non-students</u> – includes individuals who are not currently enrolled students outside of the except ons listed above. Non-students include faculty or sta , visitors to campus, non-student summer program part cipants, students' spouse, partners, and dependents.

<u>Primary Care</u> – is the diagnosis and treatment for common medical conditions. This includes care provided for chronic conditions, preventive care as well as care for acute illnesses and injuries on a same day basis.

<u>Primary Care (nurse-only facilites)</u> – is the provision of rout ne evaluat on and management for common medical conditions by a registered nurse working under dinical protocols (standing orders). This can include triage, first aid, referral and care for minor conditions.

<u>Primary Care Medical Home/Pat ent Centered Medical home</u> – is a care delivery model whereby pat ent treatment is coordinated through their

<u>Students</u> – are individuals enrolled in the inst tut on at the t me of services and/or eligible for services based on previous or upcoming enrollment. Students may include individuals accessing student health services over the summer term who are not currently enrolled but were enrolled in the preceding term or will be enrolled in the upcoming term.

<u>Telecounseling</u> – is the provision of mental health counseling through the means of telecommunications technology.

<u>Telehealth visits</u> – a real-t me, interact ve communicat on between a pat ent and a health care provider using telecommunicat ons technology (e.g. using a computer, tablet or smartphone). Phone-only encounters count as telehealth visits if they are a billable encounter.

<u>Telemedicine</u> – is the remote diagnosis and treatment of medical pat ents by means of telecommunicat ons technology.

<u>Telepsychiatry</u> – is the remote psychiatric assessment and care through means of telecommunications technology.

Total unique pat ents – unique student pat ents + unique non-student pat ents.

<u>Unique students eligible</u> – this number should represent the populat on at this point of the semester who are able to use inst tut onal health services. Exclude students who are enrolled in distance educat on, enrolled in programs such as execut ve educat on, and/or whose part-t me status does not permit access to inst tut onal health and counseling services. This number may vary throughout the operat ng year but should represent your best est mate of the number/percentage of eligible students when your inst tut on reports its enrollment to the federal government during the 6th week of the semester.

<u>Unique pat ents</u> – are the number of unique individuals with at least one dinical visit during the past full operat ng year.
